In Loving Memory of Madison Grace

If you've been to SRA recently, you may have noticed a beautiful bench located in front of the barn. And you may have also noticed that this is a memorial bench – in honor of a very special little girl named Madison. As her mom, I would love to share her story with you.

Madison began hippotherapy at SRA in April of 2021, right before her 3 rd birthday. Madison and I both fell in love with the program right away – her team was amazing, and her pony Galen was the perfect match for her. Watching her ride brought such joy to my heart, and it quickly became our favorite weekly "activity." Riding on the trails during nice weather was her absolute favorite, though she also enjoyed riding loops around the indoor arena. I was always impressed with how "big and tall" she could sit while riding, and my phone is full of photos and videos to prove it! For almost two years, 4:00 on Monday was our favorite hour of the week. I remember always worrying about when she might get "too big" for hippotherapy – once we had found this great program, I couldn't imagine her ever stopping. Unfortunately, her final lesson came much sooner than I ever imagined. On January 22, 2023, Madison very unexpectedly passed away in her sleep.

Madison suffered from Hypoxic Ischemic Encephalopathy (HIE) at birth. She was significantly impacted by her birth injury, which was subsequently followed by a lengthy list of related diagnoses. But despite her physical and cognitive limitations, Madison was truly the happiest child I've ever met. She loved life in a way that I still admire (and envy) to this day. Her smile lit up every room she entered, and she made lifelong friends everywhere she went. She was also an amazing big sister.

Whether you ever met her or not, I hope you have an opportunity to enjoy her memorial bench. Take a moment to sit, relax and enjoy the farm that Madison loved. Keeping her memory alive

is very important to me, which is why I also started the Madison Grace Memorial Foundation. The Foundation's mission is to help raise awareness and to provide financial support to organizations that benefit children with special needs. Several donations have already been made by the Foundation, and we're planning to host our first fundraiser event later this year! In February, Vinnie visited and made new friends at Providence Place at the Collegeville, an Enhanced Senior living home. He was greeted by a room full of curious spectators and they quickly became fans. He showcased his skills by playing them a little tune on the piano, as well as how easy it is to fit in his box. He had a special request to see him trot and boy did Vinnie show them how he can move. Vinnie let everyone pet and see him up close, showing off his fancy hairdo.

During March, Vinnie had a little break and started working on some new tricks. Vinnie has been working hard on a few new things. The first thing he learned was how to hold a ring in his mouth. Sometimes he wants to toss it. Vinnie has worked hard to get even better at his jumps. So his team added a hula hoop to run through as well. Vinnie mastered this on lead very quickly so he began learning how to do this off lead. Vinnie has figured it out! He is running through his hula hoop and over his jump all by himself. Wow, it is quite the show.

Vinnie made a special visit to Arcadia University for Public Health Week in April. Vinnie had selfies taken with many college students. They thought he was really pretty special.

Next up with a visit with classes from Skyview Elementary school who came to the farm to participate in our Intro to Horses program. He showed them how he jumps all the way to the 4th level. He showed them his box trick as well. Then he invited his roommate Sebastian to give the jumps a try. Vinnie was proud of his buddy for doing the jumps too.

May brought Vinnie's big off lead debut for Special Vacations, a group of about 35 people. Vinnie was very confident and ready for his show. The first time Vinnie was asked to do his hula hoop and jump he ran quickly away and pressed his easy button. He was letting the audience know that it was indeed easy to out run Kendra and Ley. The crowd loved his silliness. He proceeded to trick Kendra and Ley two more times, running over to his easy button. As the crowd roared with laughter Vinnie ran over and did his trick. However he wanted to make sure everyone knew that he was indeed in charge of this show. He did his trick backwards, going over his jump and then back through his hoop. We are very proud of Vinnie.

Vinnie made his return to the North Wales Library, a favorite for all. If you didn't know better, you would swear he was reading along wiht the book. Thank you Vinnie for bringing smiles, happiness, reassurance and joy to the people and horses of SRA.

Program Reminders:

Session Length: By now you have noticed that the program no longer operates in five, 10 week sessions. Because we are open seven days a week to accommodate the growing need, it became obvious that we needed an additional program closure week for both the herd and the humans. So we now have four sessions throughout the year however, the winter and summer sessions will now be 14 weeks and includes a two week closure in December and in July.

Make Up Policy: As a reminder, our make up policy allows for one make up per session. So please include your lesson schedule on your calendar and consult when making appointments. As always, if we cancel the lesson due to weather or for any reason, a make up will always be offered.

<u>Student Forms:</u> As outlined in the student handbook, our policy states that students need to have all of the forms updated annually. You will receive an email from Kendra requesting updated forms, please return them in timely fashion.

Weight limit: The weight limit to participate in mounted programs is 200lbs based on our current herd. We understand the sensitivity of this subject but is to keep both horse and human safe, we must monitor this. As a reminder, there is no weight limit to participate in our unmounted programs!
